This means there are a lot of heavy machine jobs available for the maintenance and repair of the equipment. Heavy machine operators are very skilled workers who are able to diagnose, troubleshoot and repair heavy machines on site or in a workshop. On occasion it can be possible for delivery drivers to operate machinery with just a simple CDL. Nonetheless, some jobs would require more particular training.
