Kelowna Telehandler Certification - A telehandler certification program could be taken by potential operators who have past experience with driving standard forklifts and for individuals with no past experiences on a lift truck. The real-world training offered by these courses produces graduates who know the correct and safe use of these kinds of machines.

Telehandler certification programs are offered in two forms: at a training facility; at the job site of the trainee. With the former alternative, the manufacturer might work along with a licensing agency to bring people to a training facility. This option provides those training with the chance to learn to make use of the machinery in a controlled environment. When finished, participants receive a certification or license to use this type of equipment.

When the training is carried out on the worksite, a qualified instructor is sent to the work location. This is the best way to make certain that your employees receive specific training on the machines which they would be working with, helping to train the trainee in their own work setting. Those training learn about possible dangerous cases which could arise on the actual work location. The instruction focuses on any conditions that are specific to the work place, allowing operators to be prepared to safely deal with these elements.

The word "telehandler" is an abbreviated version of "telescopic handler," meaning a machine which has a telescoping or extending arm supporting a fork. A telehandler has various controls and characteristics just like a forklift. A telehandler has the capability of transporting and lifting loads up and away from the vehicle. Incorrect operation of telehandlers can result in serious accidents. If load limitations are exceeded, the equipment could tip because of excess weight on the lift. It is an operator's job to know load limits and to use these equipment safely.

"Conversion" classes are designed for operators who have been certified to use a forklift. These conversion classes will teach the differences between the operation of a telehandler and a forklift, all the while trying to avoid repetitive information that the forklift operator is already familiar with. For trainees who have no former experience utilizing telehandler machines, training covers the basic utilization and operation of the machine. Some groups offer refresher courses too.
